With names like Greta Thunberg and Xiye Bastida making headlines in the past few years because of their impressive work as young environmental activists, it is becoming all the more evident that the children of the world are prepared to take matters into their own hands.

They have formed NGOs and served as plaintiffs in lawsuits to fight for the multitudes of environmental issues that matter to them and protecting their futures. One example of such is seen in South Baltimore where local teenagers have formed a group called Free Your Voice. These high school students are using their voices and their free time to try and make their neighborhoods a safer and healthier place to live. ## **Amplifying Indigenous Voices for Biodiversity**

At the 15th Conference of the Parties Convention for Biological Diversity, the Kunming-Montreal Agreement was adopted after being developed over a number of years.

With an ever-increasing number of species suffering from the consequences of human development, establishing an effective global collaborative effort is crucial to protecting the millions of species threatened by extinction. This particular plan has gained the world's attention because it marks a significant global shift to formally recognize the unparalleled efforts of Indigenous communities in preserving the planet's remaining biodiversity.

With an estimated 80% of all species living within Indigenous territories, it has grown increasingly more obvious that Indigenous voices are crucial to the conversation on biodiversity. This document explicitly outlines protocols to respect all existing and future biodiversity-related practices of Indigenous communities and calls to incorporate Traditional Knowledge into UN-led biodiversity frameworks.

The Kunming-Montreal Agreement brings hope to the fight for biodiversity because it intends to actively elevate Indigenous voices and rightfully highlight their invaluable contributions to prevent an ever eminent global extinction event.

## **Protecting the Amazon Rainforest**

The health of the Amazon Rainforest is imperative to the wellbeing of our planet. It is the host to a cornucopia of invaluable species and is also a major source of air purification for our planet. However, in recent years it has suffered a rapid decline due to deforestation for the sake of human activity.

In the last year there was a 33.3% decrease in deforestation of the Amazon Rainforest in Brazil. In the month of September there was a 66% decrease in deforestation in comparison to that of the September of the prior year! These promising numbers are all thanks to new environmental legislature and global pledges made by the country's current leaders.

This change has been entirely powered by the people and it instills hope that humanity may be able to actually preserve this natural resource which is absolutely vital to the heartbeat of the Earth.
