CTEPOs Services of 2026

It's a new year! Here is an updated list of all of the things CTEPO can do for you in 2026:

Weekly Trash Collection

Any Tribal Member living on the Reservation can be added to the weekly trash route. If you would like to be included, contact our office so that we can coordinate with you.

Recycling

The Solid Waste Team can collect your recyclables during the trash route. Each household participating in weekly collection are provided with a blue recycling bin for this purpose.

Call for Pickup

Call our Solid Waste Team to for several other types of waste collection. If we can accept it, we can collect it!

This includes:

- Bulk Waste
- E-waste
- White Waste
- Green Waste

Waste Diversion Events

Throughout the year, CTEPO will have various collection events for different types of waste. Be on the lookout for notices of these events so you can take advantage of them.

Water Quality Testing

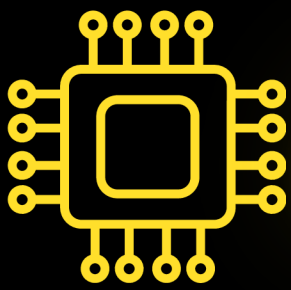
Any Tribal Member household on the Reservation can contact our office to schedule water quality testing. CTEPO will collect the samples and provide a report for the analysis.

Air Quality Testing

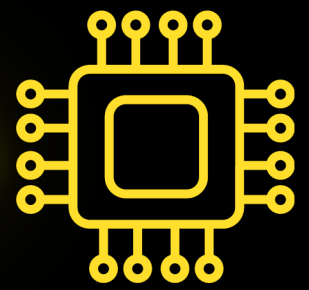
CTEPO can conduct a radon detection test at your residence or provide you with a testing kit. There are a few steps to the process so please contact us if you'd like to coordinate such for your home.

Electronic Waste



Any discarded electronic based materials or items are classified as Electronic Waste, AKA “E-Waste.”

Why do we separate E-waste?

The reason to separate e-waste from other forms of waste is to ensure the materials are properly broken down and recycled accordingly.

The precious metals and batteries often contained in e-waste be harmful to the environment if they are improperly disposed of in landfills. E-waste also contains many materials composed of finite resources. This means we need to recycle them as best we can because the Earth will not produce any more of these materials.

It is our job to make sure we dispose of our e-waste correctly to prevent harming the planet, the people of the world, and our future.

How to Throw it Away

Recycle your E-waste by taking it to an accepting facility. Many E-waste facilities will accept it for free.

Or, better yet, use CTEPO's services during an E-Waste collection event!

CTEPO will be holding an E-Waste Collection Week from January 12th- January 15th, 2026. You can drop your E-waste off at the transfer station or call CTEPO to pick it up!
